About Project and Objectives:

- The training course "Social Entrepreneurship for Social Inclusion" for youth workers, NGOs' workers and managers, trainers working with young people and youth leaders aims to clarify and promote the concept of social entrepreneurship among NGOs that work or plan to work with young people with fewer opportunities (especially with migrants, refugees, asylum seekers) for their own sustainability and for their work on promoting the issue among these young people for their personal and professional development and involvement.
- The project will support the professional development of NGOs' workers and volunteers and youth workers and with a view to innovating and improving the quality of their work across Europe.

Objectives of the project are:

- To get the participants familiar with the concept of social entrepreneurship.
- To provide the participants with the opportunity to exchange experience and expertise in the fields of social entrepreneurship and in work with young people of fewer opportunities.
- To develop the essential entrepreneurial skills and competencies at the participants.
- To provide participants with the tools and methods on creation, opening and running a social enterprise.
- To encourage NGOs to open social enterprises.
- To equip the participants with the tools and methods for activities on social entrepreneurship for young people with fewer opportunities.
- To explore practical ways of using social entrepreneurship in order to reach, involve and encourage young migrants, refugees, asylum seekers and promoting fundamental values of our society among them.
- To promote diversity, intercultural and inter-religious dialogue and tolerance among the participants.

For who is it?

Participants are expected to fall under the following criteria:

- Totally 4 people from each country
- age of 18 + Years old
- Able to work in simple English
- Highly motivated and willing to actively participate during the whole project.



Accomodation

Travel

- Plane transfer to London, and than bus/train to Plymouth. This will be additionaly organised with selected participants

Financials

- Food, board and the exchange activities are covered by the EU Programme for education, training, youth and sport **Erasmus+**.
- Regarding travel costs, participants pay the travel tickets and after the project there will be reimbursement. There is a fixed amount to be reimbursed for each country which is for both arrival and departure. For Macedonia maximum reimbursement per person is **270 Euro**.
- Participation fee is **100 Euro** per person. This should be payed in Macedonia .
